Italian Fashion Between Advertising and Sustainability - Friday, October 2

A workshop focused on research and awareness of how fashion advertising has, especially since the 1960s, told the story of fashion itself and the transformations of Italian society.

The State of Things : Migration Studies – Saturday, October 3

This workshop provides an introduction to the complex and rich field of Migration Studies. Students will learn how to read current news and build a set of resources to put diversity and inclusion back on the divisive topic of migration to counter fake populist narratives.

Understanding EU Politics Through Role Play - Saturday, October 3

An interactive introduction to European Union politics that develops critical thinking, collaboration, and decision-making through simulation.

Marketing Responsibly: Balancing Profits & Society – Saturday, Oct. 3 or Oct. 17

This workshop will provide an introduction to the conflict of marketing to obtain the best financial corporate results and the responsibility to the society in which that corporation operates.

An introduction to how businesses navigate ethical responsibility and human rights challenges in a global economy.

Climate Justice – Saturday, October 17

an accessible, in-depth introduction to ethical problems about climate justice, with attention to environmental racism, indigenous rights, gender, age, and other aspects of diversity, and to the role of individuals and institutions in climate change.

This workshop examines Italy's history from its emergence as a tourist destination to highlighting the excellences and critical issues of its key sectors today.

Hidden Biodiversity on Campus - Saturday, October 3

An inquiry-based workshop that explores local biodiversity and its connection to environmental sustainability.

A critical overview of global environmental challenges and integrated approaches to sustainability.

Urban Air Quality & Climate Future - Sunday, October 18

An applied workshop examining urban air pollution and collaborative strategies to address climate challenges.

STUDIO ARTS

Basics of Digital Photography – Sunday, October 18

A hands-on workshop introduces students to the fundamentals of photography using their cameras or also their smartphones.

Figure Arts - Saturday, October 3

Participants draw from the clothed live model using charcoal. Poses and costumes are inspired by figures in Baroque paintings in Rome. Additive and subtractive methods are among the techniques demonstrated using a kneaded eraser and a blending tool.

Linocut Printing – Saturday, October 3

Students are guided with a step-by-step approach to linoleum-cut printing, from transferring one's sketch to carving the image and eventually printing it on paper.

Rome Street Photography – Friday, October 16 or Saturday, October 17

Capture the moment' with your digital or phone camera. We'll begin with a brief introduction on photographic composition and successful strategies for street photography, followed by a self-led 'scavenger hunt' on nearby streets surrounding the legendary Spanish Steps.

Intro to Drawing – Saturday, October 17

Participants will learn how to express themselves through sketching, drawing, and the amazing technique of watercolor.

Introduction to Urban Design – Saturday, October 17

Through a mix of theory, case studies, and a collaborative design challenge, attendees will learn how to analyze space, understand human scale, and translate abstract ideas into physical forms.

Mask Making in Clay - Saturday, October 17

A sculptural workshop introducing clay modeling techniques to create a life-size portrait mask.

Recycled Paper with Wet Collage - Sunday, October 18

A creative workshop focused on handmade paper-making and collage using recycled materials.

An accessible introduction to digital security and cyber risks in everyday online environments.

A practical workshop designed to strengthen public speaking and effective communication skills.
