




Neighborhood

Temple University, Japan Campus (TUJ) moved to a purpose-built building on Showa Women's University's (SWU) campus in August 2019.


The new six-story building is located a 7-minute walk from Sangen-jaya Station on the Tokyu Den-en-toshi Line.




FACILITIES AT TUJ

AN AMERICAN EDUCATION

Temple University, Japan Campus (TUJ) is an international campus of one of the United States' largest research universities—Temple University in Philadelphia—and is accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education. Founded in 1982, TUJ is officially recognized by Japan's Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science, and Technology and offers American bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees in Tokyo. TUJ students receive the same credits, degrees and transcripts as students at Main Campus in Philadelphia.

American **Educational System**

As an American university, TUJ offers flexibility in enrollment, credit transferability and majors built on a liberal arts foundation.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

"Can I transfer credits to TUJ?" Yes, you can.

- Students must complete 45 of the last 60 hours of their degree program at Temple University.
- A transfer credit evaluation is provided once a student is accepted.
- College credit can also be earned through Advanced Placement (AP) examinations, the International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme, GCE A Levels, CLEP, DSST and military training.

CREDIT TRANSFER PROGRAM









Under the Credit Transfer Program, TUJ students can enhance their educational opportunities by taking courses at other Japanese universities as part of their degree programs.

STUDY ABROAD STUDENTS

"Can I study at TUJ for one or two semesters and then return to my home university?"

Students can choose from ten different majors at TUJ. Certain majors such as International Business Studies, International Affairs and Psychological Studies require internships or research projects that help develop practical work experience and a high level of expertise. Students may also transfer to Main Campus in Philadelphia to complete any of the majors offered there (some majors have separate admission requirements).



INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS STUDIES (Major/Minor)

Combines knowledge of economics and society with the analytical skills required to succeed in a globalized and multi-cultural business environment.



COMMUNICATION STUDIES (Major)

Embraces a variety of disciplines from Temple's Klein College of Media and Communication, including critical and mass media studies, production, journalism, advertising, and rhetoric. The major has a Production Track with an emphasis in visual or audio production. To develop as professionals, students may undertake an optional internship in a variety of related fields.



PSYCHOLOGICAL STUDIES (Major/Minor)

Provides a broad understanding of psychology as the science of human behavior and of underlying mental processes, while focusing on cross-cultural and Asian issues.



ASIAN STUDIES (Major/Minor)

Provides an understanding of the Asia-Pacific region's rich cultural traditions, shared history, rapid social change, environmental challenges, and regional tensions with the benefit of learning an East Asian language.



INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS (Major)

Analyzes international cooperation and conflict, poverty and development, and political and social change. The focus is global but with a particular emphasis on East Asia.



ART (Major/Minor)

Equips students with an interdisciplinary perspective on contemporary art and design, providing various analog and digital media skills as well as the sociohistorical contexts essential to critical art practice.



POLITICAL SCIENCE (Major/Minor)

Analyzes and systematizes political systems, political theory and international relations. A Distinction in Major is awarded to highly motivated, qualified students.



ECONOMICS (Major/Minor)

Addresses issues such as economic development and finance, while looking at Japan's place in Asian and global economy.



JAPANESE LANGUAGE (Major/Minor) Promotes advanced proficiency in Japanese and preparation

for careers in Japanese and international markets.



GENERAL STUDIES (Major)

Provides the opportunity to design an interdisciplinary major in the humanities or social sciences, or create a set of courses based around an intellectual theme.



Bridge **Program**

(for non-native English speakers)

The Undergraduate Bridge Program is designed for non-native English speakers who need to further develop their academic skills in English. Applicants to the program receive conditional admittance to TUJ's Undergraduate Program. Students participating in the Bridge Program can also earn up to 15 credits towards their undergraduate degree. Additionally, students can apply for a Japanese student visa through TUJ.

BRIDGE PROGRAM LEVELS

There are three levels in the Bridge Program. Each Bridge level lasts one semester. Upon enrollment, students take a placement test to determine their appropriate level. Applicants cannot choose their level in the program.

Depending on placement test results, students may start from different levels regardless of their English test scores. Visa-sponsored Bridge students are expected to complete the Bridge Program within one year.



MILITARY & VETERAN STUDENTS

Students eligible for the GI Bill (Post-9/11 and Montgomery) may use these funds towards tuition and fees at TUJ.

TUJ SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are awarded to select incoming students each semester. Award decisions are based on academic merit, records of past achievements, and extracurricular activities.

How to be Considered for a TUJ Scholarship

OTHER OPPORTUNTIES

Diamond Research Scholars Program

Undergraduate students have the opportunity to engage in a focused, mentored research or creative arts project during the summer and fall. Includes a stipend during the summer.

External Scholarships

Many cultural and academic organizations, businesses and government offices offer scholarships. Research online and ask your professors and supervisors to see what may be available. Check the TUJ website for links to useful scholarship search sites.

Scholarships for Continuing Students

Full-time undergraduate students who have completed 12 credits are eligible to apply. Scholarship awards are based on academic merit and, in some cases, financial need.

Activities and Events


